The Digital Demography panel built on the work of its predecessor (the panel on Big Data and Population Processes - <u>https://iussp.org/en/panel/big-data-and-population-processes</u> - in order to consolidate the field of Digital Demography and to promote exchange and collaboration between demographers, computer scientists and social scientists, broadly defined.

In three years (2018-2021), the panel organized workshops, tutorials, short courses and webinars, as side events at major conferences, or as standalone meetings. An additional tutorial on text analysis was scheduled to be held at the Annual Meeting of the Population Association of America (2020), but was cancelled due to the cancellation of the conference as a result of the pandemic. Related materials were then posted online and made available to anyone.

Some of the workshops focused on training; others on fostering research collaborations. Some were held at population conferences, others at venues attended by computer scientists, or at United Nations events. Given the pandemic, all events scheduled after March 2020 have been held online and reached an even broader audience, especially in low- and middle-income countries. One of the outcomes of the panel activities is a growing community of demographers trained in computation and computer scientists trained in demography.

This community is very energetic, and the panel helped sustain it and consolidate it. The digital demography panel also expanded the scope of the previous panel by promoting not only the use of digital trace data for demographic purposes, but also by improving our understanding of the implications of the digitalization of life for health, well-being and demographic behavior.
